Anna Jones-Crabtree and Doug Crabtree, owner-operators of Vilicus Farms in Montana, decided early on that they wanted to work with the vast, dry landscape of the Northern Plains rather than against it -- ideally recreating part of the original prairie ecosystem that once existed. Almost a decade into the effort, the result is a staggering 26% of their farm in non-crop areas set aside to serve the creatures and natural processes that the farm relies on to keep it resilient in the face of change.
