The new ranking system from Friends of the Earth (FOE) benchmarks the top 25 retailers in the United States on practices and policies of pesticide use throughout their supply chains. As retailers continue to step up to address concerns of insect decline around the globe, the scorecard from FOE provides one comparison of food retailers on their efforts to acknowledge and support pollinators in their sourcing.

With rising attention on sustainable business practices and sourcing, third-party verified programs such as Bee Better Certified are ideally positioned to help food companies communicate to consumers the clear impacts of the work they are doing to protect pollinators and biodiversity.

Despite the setbacks and challenges brought to every industry by the pandemic this year, our staff has been working closely with four different vineyards in three major winegrape growing regions of California providing both technical and financial support to help these vineyards achieve Bee Better Certification. This work is a continuation of our efforts to expand Bee Better Certified (BBC)



within the wine industry (click here to read more about the project's launch).

After months of planning and preparation, this fall we broke ground (literally) on these projects. Throughout the month of October, Bee Better and Xerces Society staff, farm labor crews, and volunteers planted the equivalent of almost a mile of high quality pollinator habitat at the four participating farms.
